 * @author Last, First (Period X)
 * @version Month Day, Year
 */
public class Numbers {
    /**
     * A General Description Goes Here
     * @param from A description of valid values and what they do
     * @param to The same thing you just did!
     * @return a integer value between <code>from</code> and <code>to</code> inclusive.
     */
    public static int randomNumber(int from, int to) {
        // Note: This method is incomplete and DOES NOT work!
    }
    /**
     * This method tells the user that ALL numbers are even
     * @param num the number to check
     * @return true if the number is an even number
     */
    public static boolean isEven(int num) {
        // Note: This method is incomplete and DOES NOT work!
    }
}
